
Taught by Australia's leading film industry professionals

The Filmmaking Summer School offers intensive hands-on teaching in many aspects of professional film production. Each day or session is taught by Australia's leading film industry practitioners in their area of expertise.

The course is designed to cover the essential skills, basic knowledge and industry insight needed to make films, knowledge that would normally require years of experience to acquire, and will equip participants with the confidence, knowledge and skills to start a career in film or television and translate their own ideas and visions to the screen. The summer school is designed for people with little or no prior filmmaking experience, practising filmmakers wanting to change career direction, media teachers and students.

In 2026 we will be presenting **3 choices of courses.** The 5 day Script to Screen (Jan 7 to 11), the 1 day Devising and Bringing a Script to Life - Writing, Directing & Acting (Jan 7), and the 4 day Cinematography -Make a Film (Jan 8 to 11).

You can choose whichever course you want or do it all (Script to Screen).



Devising and Bringing a Script to Life - Writing, Directing & Acting

Participants, in pairs or groups, will learn how to devise, then act in and direct, a short story - and have a great time discovering how to bring their script to life. We'll also look at the director/actor relationship, casting, rehearsing, acting styles, blocking and performance. We'll explore specific tools and techniques used by actors and directors and gain experiential insight into the actor's and director's craft. Wednesday 7 January



Cinematography - Make a Film Cameras, Lighting, Visual Storytelling, Sound

What does a Director of Photography do? We look at cinematography essentials such as designing a "look" and 'feel" for your story, composition, framing, continuity, crossing the line, blocking scenes, scene coverage, production design and we explore creative choices of lighting, lenses and camera movement. We will examine specific scenes in scripts and films to work out what makes a good shot and why. We'll learn how to interpret the script in visual terms with storyboarding and how to tell stories with stills and we'll learn how cinematography conveys meaning and enhances story. Thursday 8 January.

Shooting Your Film

Learn practical lighting set-ups in a controlled environment. We'll learn basic three-point lighting using documentary interview techniques including best sound practices. You can choose to make a short film, mini documentary or music video. In groups, participants will write, location scout, produce, act in, direct and take turns operating the equipment. We'll be using state-of-the-art high definition digital cameras and utilising professional lighting gear. We'll learn how to achieve the best possible "look" with minimum gear. We'll also learn how to enhance production values through camera movement. By shooting their own works in groups, participants will understand how images, when put together, tell effective visual stories. Films will be edited and viewed on the last day of the cinematography course.

Friday 9 January and Saturday 10 January.



Post Production- Editing

This day will be spent editing your films and viewing them at the end of the day. **Sunday 11 January.**

Participants are advised to book early to secure a place in this popular course, which books out quickly every year
